Paraguay

The year 11's are now in the middle of their IGCSE exams along with their national exams. The year 12's are coming to the end of their school days. They had their last day in school on the 25th and with it all the Goodbyes from staff and pupils. They are now on their final exams as they get ready to leave after 15 years in the school for most of them. The rest of the school continues with normal classes until November 11th when they go onto half days and final exams.

This was arranged by the Paraguay Marathon Club and many people turned out for it including the British ambassador and his wife. They went for the run, we went for the walk!! The Marathon people couldn't believe that all the money raised was going to be given away to help the Annexe school and the homes the kids visit. We went to visit the homes they support last week and also to help out with Operation Smile. It is always good to see them in different situations that they wouldn't normally have to face. The Primary kids made posters to decorate the hospital.
