### God provides water: Weds 8 – Tues 14 September

We thank God for Paraguay and remember the words recorded in Deuteronomy 11:12-14 *It is a land the LORD your God cares for; the eyes of the LORD your God are continually on it from the beginning of the year to its end. So if you faithfully obey the commands I (Moses) am giving you today—to love the LORD your God and to serve him with all your heart and with all your soul- then I will send rain on your land in its season, both autumn and spring rains, so that you may gather in your grain, new wine and oil. I will provide grass in the fields for your cattle, and you will eat and be satisfied.*

We thank God for the **wells** which Mission Paraguay helped to dig in the Chaco and for this provision of much needed water. We also thank God for the new underground water cistern being dug at the Diocesan Centre in Rio Verde, thankful for the generosity of Mission Paraguay support which is making this possible.

Please pray for rain in areas of South America which have been badly affected by seasonal **bush fires** causing pollution, destruction and respiratory diseases. Several parts of Paraguay have been affected and Asunción city is currently affected by smog and possibly some air flights will be cut in an attempt to alleviate the situation.

We pray for **rain in the Chaco** soon. This often begins again during the middle of September at the end of the Paraguayan winter.

Please pray for this weekend's EMA **Anglican Marriage Encounter** weekend, for Ronald & Nicky Irene's pastoral oversight of the weekend. Miriam and Miguel Greco ask us to thank God for and pray for Elvio & Sandra, Ramón & Rosie, Juanca & Marlene, and Manolo & Shirley and to pray that eyes may be opened to see God's glory. We also pray for all who will take part this weekend, especially for the new couples that marriages will be strengthened and that Jesus Christ will be the centre of these marriages.

Beryl Baker asks us to pray for **cattle ranches in the Chaco**: 'I feel that God will answer prayer for rain if people put him first again.' Please pray for a call to repentance for the abuses of the environment in the Chaco and for a letting go of the idol of money. We especially pray for Chaco ranchers to grow in the desire to be governed by God rather than the idols of greed and self interest. *Be careful, or you will be enticed to turn away and worship other gods and bow down to them. Then the LORD's anger will burn against you, and he will shut the heavens so that it will not rain and the ground will yield no produce, and you will soon perish from the good land the LORD is giving you.* Deut 1:16, 17 We pray for the Anglican men in the Chaco who work on the ranches for protection, for safety and for their families who stay behind in the communities.

We pray for the planning of **St Andrews school trips** to the Chaco this year. We pray that there will be sufficient water in Rio Verde for the classes to be able to stay and their projects will be of blessing to them and the communities that they visit.

Please pray for **Chris Hawksbee** and his work in the Chaco remember the NGO, Global Chaco which is going very well, the beneficiaries are very pleased and enthusiastic with its development. We also pray for **Alison** in Asuncion teaching at ACA, for strength and time for her Open University course.

### **Wise builders: Weds 15 – Tues 21 September**

Jesus said: *Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. Father God, we pray for **families** that have been abandoned by fathers and mothers and pray that just as you heard the cry of Hagar and her son in the desert, so to you will hear our cry for the young ones who live without the care and protection of their parents. Lord we pray that their needs, spiritual, physical and emotional will be met. ### **Speaking that honours God: Weds 27 - Sun 31 October**

A bird that you set free may be caught again, but a word that escapes your lips will not return. Jewish Proverb  
*The disciples were amazed at his (Jesus') words. Mark 10:24... when they (all the people) heard Jesus' words, they acknowledged that God's way was right Luke 7:29* What a challenge for us his followers, that the words that we speak would be as Jesus' words, words that bring life, hope and blessings.
