### Week Sun 15 – Sat 21 Sep: Always rejoicing!

*Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!* Philippians 4:4

Let us rejoice in the Lord's goodness to Sharon McCririe, who suffered a stroke whilst out shopping in Asuncion. 'God-incidentally' the father of one of her former pupils was in the shop at the same time and recognized her and was able to go round to her house and advise her neighbours who very kindly lent the admission money required before the clinic would agree to treat her. Rejoice in the Lord's healing touch as she is progressing well and she using the hand, arm and leg that the doctors thought would remain paralyzed. Her family is planning to have her flown back to the States for rehabilitation. Please pray for Sharon's recovery and for further fruit from the seeds she has sown. Rejoice that the Lord causes the seeds his servants sow to grow and give fruit.

Chris Hawksbee asks us to rejoice, giving thanks and praise:

- the construction on the church building in La Paciencia, La Patria is nearing completion.

In fact, I want to become a professional teacher so that I can repay them for all that they have invested in me. I am thankful for all the support which is enabling me to do this! We thank the Lord for each student at FEISA and pray that the Lord will help them in their studies to become excellent teachers and teaching assistants.

We rejoice that recently there was much needed rainfall in the Chaco which is extremely dry and ask you to pray for the Lord to send more rain.
