Let us pray for NGOs and the government in Paraguay as they deal with indigenous groups seeking to obtain **land rights** to enable them to live with greater dignity. Let us also pray for the ranch owners for a change of heart and compassion towards those who are dependent on them for work. The ranch owners control much land and are currently facing harsh consequences as a result of the recent outbreaks of foot and mouth.

On Valentine's Day we pray for all the EMA **Marriage Encounter** couples that they would grow in commitment to and love for each other. We pray for Ronald and Nicky Irene in their pastoral oversight of EMA that they would continually seek the Lord for wisdom and discernment in this responsibility. We pray for the EMA Bible studies that they would get off to a good start this year, and we thank the Lord for the couples which attend. Amen.

We pray for school chaplain Rev Ronald Irene leading the opening **school assembly** on 15<sup>th</sup> Feb for openness in the hearts of the students to the Gospel, for a spiritual response to the Word.

### **Week Sun 19 – Sat 25 Feb Lent - Jesus goes to the cross to bring us peace**

Paraguayans love harmony and peace, but dealing with conflict is not easy within Paraguayan cultural norms. *Peace - Shalom means wholeness, fullness, totality, completeness. In relationships, it doesn't mean the absence of war or discord, but the presence of goodwill and harmony.* How do these descriptions of 'shalom' compare with your own understanding of the word 'peace'? (USPG Lent resources).

*Jesus went into the temple complex and drove out all those buying and selling in the temple. He overturned the money changers' tables and the chairs of those selling doves. And He said to them, "It is written, My house will be called a house of prayer. But you are making it a den of thieves!" The blind and the lame came to Him in the temple complex, and He healed them. Matthew 21:12-14*

As we walk these weeks towards the cross in prayer with Jesus let us pray for the church in Paraguay for:

**Tim Curtis** and the translation team – Asuncion and Juan, thanking God for the Scriptures in Enxet that are bringing the Gospel of peace and healing to the Enxet people. We pray for good concentration and work patterns for the team, and spiritual protection.

**Church leaders** to granted the willingness to face conflict where it is necessary for the good of the body of Christ, and to be filled with grace and wisdom.

Lord of peace, we pray for all **young people** in our churches that they would be able to live peaceably with their families, friends and work & study companions. We pray for David Greco as he heads up EJE Youth Encounter ministry that he would be given wisdom and courage in his leadership. We also pray for all those who head up youth groups, remembering Carlos & Dina, Luis Cabañas, Esteban Romero and Donald Brooks. Situations where there have been **relationship problems** within the church that all involved will forgive and be compassionate and that Jesus will bring healing.

We pray for our churches that we would have **peaceable relations** with our neighbours and the other Christian groupings in our communities.

We remember in prayer those who are preparing to engage in **short term ministry** in the Diocese of Paraguay, remembering the Mission group from St Marks Haydock and the Drs Forde, we thank God for their willingness to partner with the church in Paraguay, praying that the Lord's peace would guide them in all their preparations.

*Then the LORD said to Moses, 'Tell Aaron and his sons to bless the people of Israel with this special blessing: 'May the LORD bless you and protect you. May the LORD smile on you and be gracious to you. May the LORD show you his favour and give you his peace.' Whenever Aaron and his sons bless the people of Israel in my name, I myself will bless them.'* Numbers 6:22 – 27 As you pray for yourself this week you might like to ask the Lord to grant you His peace and help you bless others with this peace.

### **Week Sun 26 – Wed 29 Feb - Encouraged in faith**

*When the disciples saw it, they were amazed and said, 'How did the fig tree wither so quickly?' Jesus answered them, 'I assure you: If you have faith and do not doubt, you will not only do what was done to the fig tree, but even if you tell this mountain, 'Be lifted up and thrown into the sea,' it will be done. And if you believe, you will receive whatever you ask for in prayer.'* Matt 21:20 – 22

God is often at work, below the soil as it were, like a bulb about to break through. Make a list of 5 encouraging things that you have observed during the last month and give thanks to God for his work.

God uses mountains to refine our faith and often the mountains in the way seem very large! Jesus is not calling us to pronounce dramatic prayers but rather to be closer to him. The closer we draw the more effective our prayers will be. We need more than just knowledge about God, we are being called to place our trust in His goodness, power, foreknowledge, mercy, grace and His work on the cross. As we do so He will act according to His will. This week why not ask God to work in your heart and encourage you in your faith?

A preacher once pointed out that there are basically 2 types of people in churches: one sort seeks to find faults in others and the church, and the other type tries to build up their church and their fellow believers. Which description best fits your life and your dealings with others? Let us pray for ourselves and all Anglicans in Paraguay to grow in encouraging others:

- the desperate
- the discouraged
- other disciples

Ask God to show you someone who could do with a good dose of encouragement and ask Him to help you be an encourager in that person's life. Pray for that person and chose to speak to that person and act towards them in a way that encourages them. It is certain that as we change and become encouragers God will be glorified, others will grow and be built up and God will reward us when we arrive home in glory!
